ANNOUNCEMENT

1. GENERAL REGULATIONS

IWIS International Training Center, together with Figure & Speed Skating Association of Thailand, is pleased to invite you to attend the 2026 Thailand Open Figure Skating Trophy - Interclub Competition. The competition will be conducted in accordance with the ISU Constitution and General Regulations 2024, as well as the current ISU Rules and Regulations and ISU Communications valid for the Season 2025/2026.

Participation in 2026 Thailand Open Figure Skating Trophy is open to all Competitors of the ISU Member and Clubs being members of National Federations, and qualify with regard to eligibility to Rule 107 number 15 Interclub Competitions. Passports of all Skaters, as well as the ISU Clearance Certificate, if applicable, must be presented at the accreditation of the event for verification.

The Organizing Committee reserves the right to enter additional skaters in each category and limit entries in any event in case of too many entries.

INTERCLUB FIGURE SKATING COMPETITIONS:

Advanced Pre-Novice (boys & girls): has reached the age of 7 and has not reached 11 (Born between July 1, 2014 and June 30, 2018)

Basic Pre-Novice (boys & girls): has reached the age of 7 and has not reached 11 (Born between July 1, 2014 and June 30, 2018)

Advanced Juvenile (boys & girls): has not reached age of 8 (Born on or after 1 July, 2017)

Basic Juvenile (boys & girls): has not reached age of 8 (Born on or after 1 July, 2017)

Crystal Adults (men & women): has reached at least the age of 28 before 1st July 2025

Advanced Pre-Novice - Boys and Girls : Free Skating

A well balanced Free Skating program for Advanced Pre-Novice must contain:

- 1.) Maximum of four (4) jump elements. One of which must be an Axel type jump. There may be up to two (2) jump combinations or one jump combination and one jump sequence. A jump combination can contain only two (2) jumps. In the jump sequence, the second jump must be an Axel type jump with a direct step from the landing curve of the first jump into the take-off curve of the Axel Jump. No triple and quadruple jumps are allowed. Only one single jump and one double jump (including Double Axel) can be repeated once. Triple and quadruple jumps are not permitted.
- 2.) There must be a maximum of two (2) spins of a different nature (abbreviation), one of which must be a combination spin, and one must be a spin in one position. All spins with change of foot must contain a minimum of eight (8) revolutions or without change of foot must contain a minimum of six (6) revolutions.
Combination spin with 3 basic positions will receive full value. If this requirement is not fulfilled, the spin will be marked with a V. In both spins, flying entries are allowed.
- 3.) There must be a maximum of one (1) choreographic sequence consisting of at least two (2) different skating movements.

Levels: in all elements which are subject to levels, only features up to level 2 will be counted. Any additional features will not be counted for level requirements and will be ignored by the Technical Panel.

Music Duration: 1.50 +/- 10 seconds

- Skating Skills

The factor for the Program Components is

Boys: 1.67

Girls: 1.67

Basic Pre-Novice - Boys and Girls : Free Skating

A well-balanced Free Skating program for Basic Pre-Novice must contain:

- 1.) Maximum of three (3) jump elements. There may be up to one (1) jump combination or sequence. The jump combination can contain only two (2) jumps. In the jump sequence, the second jump must be an Axel type jump with a direct step from the landing curve of the first jump into the take-off curve of the Axel jump. Only one jump can be repeated once in both solo and combination jumps. Triple and quadruple jumps are not permitted.
- 2.) There must be a maximum of two (2) spins of a different nature (abbreviation). One of which must be an upright spin on one foot. All the spins without change of foot must have five (5) revolutions, with change of foot, three (3) revolutions on each foot. Flying entry is not allowed.

Combination spin with 3 basic positions will receive full value, and all spins with change of foot must have at least 3 revolutions on each foot. If these requirements are not fulfilled, the spin will be marked with a V.
- 3.) There must be a maximum one (1) choreographic sequence consisting of at least one (1) skating movement. One must be a backward spiral hold at least for three (3) seconds. If this requirement is not fulfilled, the element will receive no value.

Levels: in all elements which are subject to levels, only features up to level 2 will be counted. Any additional features will not be counted for level requirements and will be ignored by the Technical Panel.

Music Duration: 1.30 +/- 10 seconds

Advanced Juvenile - Boys and Girls : Free Skating

A well-balanced Free Skating program for Advanced Juvenile must contain:

- 1.) Maximum of three (3) jump elements. There may be up to one (1) jump combination or sequence. A jump combination can contain only two (2) single jumps. In the jump sequence, the second jump must be a single Axel jump with a direct step from the landing curve of the first jump into the take-off curve of the Axel jump. Only one single jump can be repeated once in both solo and combination jumps. Double, Triple and quadruple jumps are not permitted.
- 2.) Maximum of two (2) spins. Spins without change of foot must have at least 4 revolutions, with change of foot must have at least 3 revolutions on each foot. In both spins, flying entry is not allowed.

Combination spin with 3 basic positions will receive full value, and all spins with change of foot must have at least 3 revolutions on each foot. If these requirements are not fulfilled, the spin will be marked with a V.
- 3.) There must be a maximum one (1) choreographic sequence consisting of at least one (1) skating movement. One must be a forward spiral held for a minimum of three (3) seconds. If this requirement is not fulfilled, the element will receive no value.

Levels: in all elements which are subject to levels, only features up to level 2 will be counted. Any additional features will not be counted for level requirements and will be ignored by the Technical Panel.

Music Duration: 1.20 +/- 10 seconds

Basic Juvenile - Boys and Girls : Free Skating

A well-balanced Free Skating program for Basic Juvenile must contain:

- 1.) Maximum of three (3) jump elements, one of which must be a Waltz Jump. There may be up to one (1) jump combination or sequence. A jump combination can contain only two (2) jumps. In the jump sequence, the second jump must be a Waltz Jump or a Single Axel jump with a direct step from the landing curve of the first jump into the take-off curve of the second jump. Only one jump can be repeated once in both solo and combination jumps. Double, Triple and quadruple jumps are not permitted.
- 2.) Maximum of two (2) spins, one of which must be an upright spin on two feet (minimum of 3 revolutions). Another spin can be spin in one position (different abbreviation) or combination spin without change of foot (minimum of 4 revolutions), two basic positions in a combo spin is allowed. In both spins, flying entry is not allowed. Combination spin with 3 basic positions will receive full value. If this requirement is not fulfilled, the spin will be marked with a V.
- 3.) There must be a maximum one (1) choreographic sequence consisting of at least one skating movement. One must be a forward lunge held for a minimum of three (3) seconds. If this requirement is not fulfilled, the element will receive no value.

Levels: in all elements which are subject to levels, only features up to level 1 will be counted. Any additional features will not be counted for level requirements and will be ignored by the Technical Panel.

Music Duration: 1.00 +/- 10 seconds

Deduction for Pre-novice and Juvenile

a) Interruption

For every Interruption of:

 - falls in elements will be called by the Technical Panel but with **no deduction(s)**.

Crystal Adults - Men and Women : Free Skating

A well-balanced Free Skating program for Crystal Adults must contain:

- 1.) A maximum of four (4) jump elements, consisting only of single jumps. **Axel type jumps, double jumps and triple jumps are not permitted.** There may be one (1) jump combination in the free program.
 - a. The jump combination may consist of two (2) listed jumps.
 - b. Each listed jump may be performed a maximum of two (2) times.
 - c. Waltz jumps will be ignored.
- 2.) A maximum of two (2) spins of a different abbreviation, both of which must be a spin in one position with or without a change of foot. **Flying spins are not permitted.**
 - a. The spins must have a required minimum number of revolutions: three (3) for any spin with no change of foot, and six (6) with a change of foot.
 - b. A spin that has no basic position with 2 revolutions will receive no value.
 - c. All spins with change of foot must have at least 3 revolutions on each foot. If this requirement is not fulfilled, the spin will be marked with a V.
 - d. Only features up to and including Level 1 will be counted. Any additional features will not count for level requirements and will be ignored by the Technical Panel.
- 3.) A maximum of one (1) choreographic sequence utilizing at least half (1/2) of the ice surface.
 - a. The pattern is not restricted but the sequence must be clearly visible.
 - b. A choreographic sequence has a base value and will be evaluated by the judges in GOE only.

Levels: in all elements which are subject to levels, only features up to level 1 will be counted. Any additional features will not be counted for level requirements and will be ignored by the Technical Panel.

Music Duration: 1.40 +/- 10 seconds

- Presentation
- Skating Skills

The factor for the Program Components is

Men: 2.00

Women: 2.00

Fall Outside of Elements Deduction -0.50

Falls in elements will be called by the Technical Panel but with **no deduction(s)**.

STARTING ORDER - DRAW

Rule 512 Draws

The draws for the starting order of all Segments are made publicly by the Referee. The Referee should ask the Organizing Committee to check the correct spelling of the names of the Competitors and Officials.

Starting numbers shall be drawn by each Competitor, if present, by official representatives of their ISU Member / club or by members of the Organizing Committee.

The official announcement of the entries and of the panels of Officials is made by the Referee of each competition at the time of the first starting order draw of that competition.

The draws will take place on April 28, 2026. The schedule will be published after final entry.

3. ENTRIES

Entries of Competitors

1. All entries should be made by ISU Members or clubs which are members of National Figure Skating Federations.
2. The official entry forms with passport copies must be completed and sent to iwisskating@gmail.com no later than April 1, 2026 - 20:00 h (local time BANGKOK).

Participation in multiple categories is not permitted. Each skater may compete in one (1) category only. The Organizing Committee reserves the right to enter additional skaters in each category and limit entries in any event in case of too many entries.

Entries of Team Officials

Official entries of Team Leaders, Assistant Team Leaders, Team Medical Staff and Coaches must be made using the official form and email to iwisskating@gmail.com

Accreditation will be provided to those who are officially accepted by the Organizer.

Please be advised that only one (1) Coach per Skater will be accredited. An Assistant Team Leader will be accepted for Teams having six (6) and more Skaters. Not more than one (1) Team Doctor and one (1) Team Physiotherapist will be accepted as the Team Medical Staff, for which the organizer requests the right to have a medical certification (document) presented before accreditation.

ENTRY FEE

With the entry to the competition, the entry fee must be paid as follows:

5,000 THB - All interclub categories

The entry fee will not be refunded in case of withdrawals for any reason.

After the final entry by name on **Wednesday, April 1 – 20:00 (local time Bangkok)** respective Member Federation or club will receive an invoice for Entry fee with bank details. Entry fee must be paid on or before **April 15, 2026** via bank transfer.

4. MEALS, LODGING AND TRAVEL EXPENSES

The organizer will arrange full board accommodation for the Referees, Judges, Technical Controller, Technical Specialists and Data and Replay Operators beginning dinner Thursday, April 28, 2026, until breakfast on Friday, May 2, 2026.

The **travel expenses** will be covered only for invited officials.

The organizer will not be able to cover any expenses for competitors and team officials.

5. MUSIC / PLANNED PROGRAM CONTENT

In accordance with Rule 343 in the ISU Special Regulations & Technical Rules Single & Pair Skating and Ice Dance, the following method to submit the Competitor's music to the Organizing Committee must be followed:

All Competitors shall furnish competition music of excellent quality on mp3 format by sending separately the music file to iwisskating@gmail.com until April 14, 2026 (two weeks before the event). Any other format is not acceptable.

The title of the file must show the Nation, Competition event, Competitor's name, and the exact running time of the music (not skating time) including any starting signal.

Example: `THA_JuniorWoman_SP_Surname-Name_2:48`

Each Competitor must have an own back-up drive (USB Stick) for each program in the format of MP3 file. CDs will not be accepted. During the 1st Official Practice, the music will be played as indicated in the Practice Schedule and competitors will be allowed the correctness of the submitted music. If there is an issue with the music, the Team Leader/Coach may be allowed to change the music by presenting an acceptable reproduction to the Organizing Committee's Music Team (USB Stick with file format `_MP3_file`).

The Planned Program Content and Music Information must be sent to the OC using the provided official forms no later than April 1, 2026.

If music information is not complete and/or the music is not provided, accreditation will not be given.

6. ACCOMMODATION

Participants are to cover their own travel and hotel arrangement. There is no official hotel for the event. No shuttles will be provided. Participants should take care of their own travel arrangement. Please feel free to choose your most convenient option. Suggested hotel as listed:

9. INSURANCE / LIABILITY

In accordance with Rule 119, it is the sole responsibility of each Member participating in the 2026 Thailand Open Figure Skating Trophy, to provide medical and accident insurance for their athletes, officials and all other members of the Member's team. Such insurance must assure full medical attendance and the return of the ill or injured person to the home country by air transport or by other expeditious means. It is an internal matter of each ISU Member / club to decide the issue of who shall pay the premium for such insurance.

The Organizer assumes no responsibility for or liability with respect to bodily or personal injury or property damage in connection incurred by Competitors and Officials. The medical emergency service will be present at the ice-rink during the Competition.

All participants will receive a certificate of participation. The exact time of the Award Ceremonies will be announced in the detailed schedule in due time.
